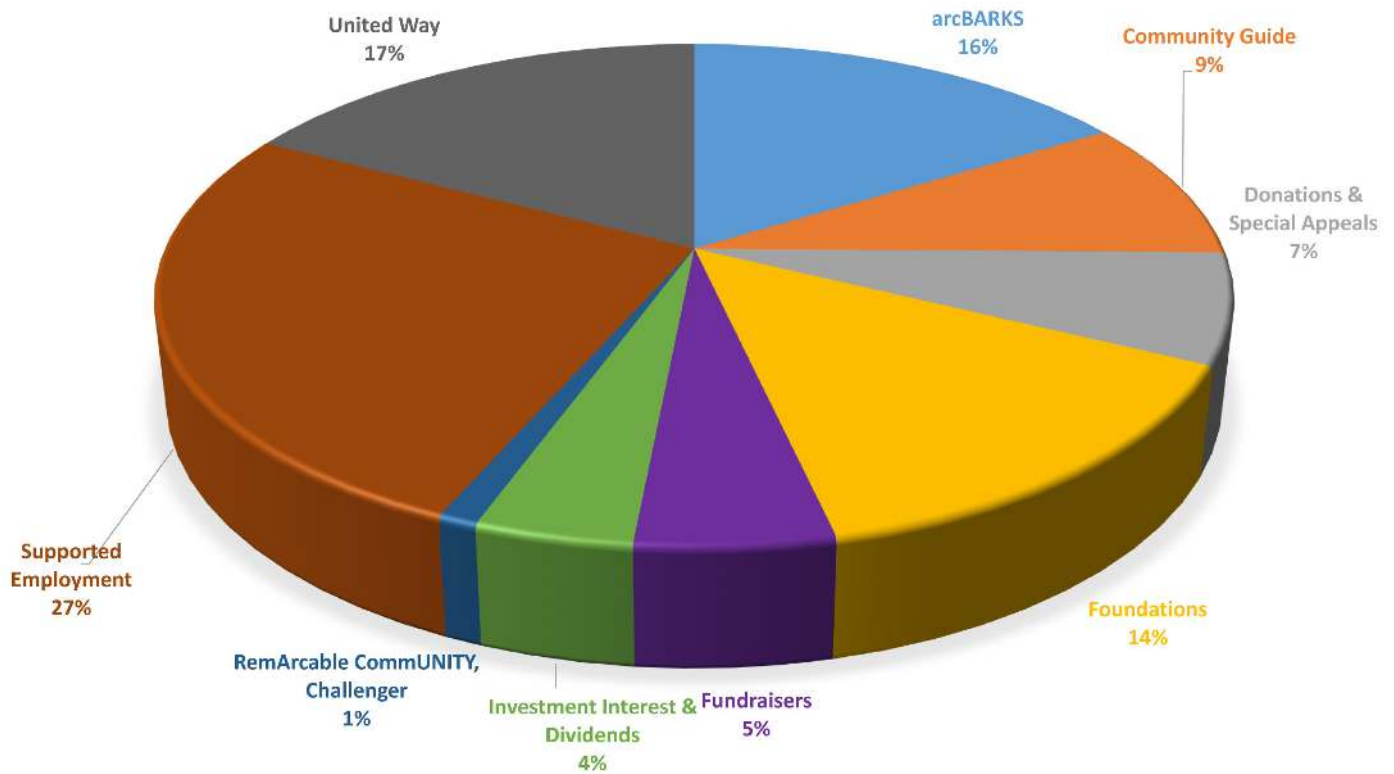

Year in Review

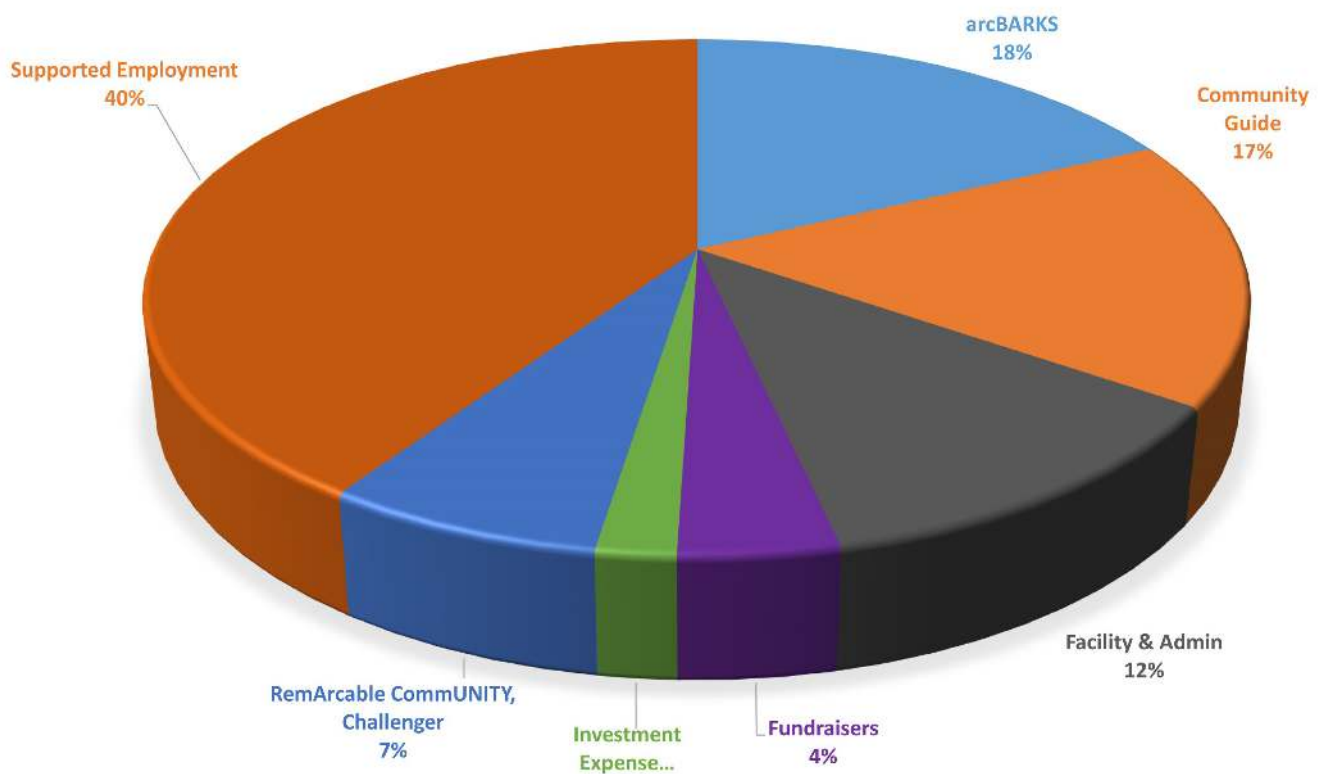
- Re-accreditation for an additional 3 years from CARF International (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities) December 2015. We received a Three-Year accreditation that applies to the following services:
 - Community Employment Services: Employment Supports
 - Community Employment Services: Job Development
 - Services Coordination: Community GuideThis accreditation will extend through January 31, 2019. This achievement is an indication of our organization's dedication and commitment to improving quality of the lives of the persons served. Our services, personnel, and documentation indicate our continued desire to the conformance to standards.
- Served over 150 children and adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, (I/DD) in our Challenger Sports League, who enjoy the benefit of physical activity and socialization. Abilities Tennis is in their 3rd year of offering skills clinics and tournament and Special Olympic participation.
- Served 126 individuals in Greensboro Self Advocacy Program, Job Club and Beyond the Canvas programs
- The Employment Specialist Staff has assisted 100 consumers with: training, job development services, retraining in the job place, personal care services, Long-Term Support and stabilization on their new jobs.
- Provided Community Guide services to 65 individuals with I/DD
- Operated a successful job training dog treat bakery with 16 chefs (arcBARKS)
- Operated a successful Project Search High School Work Transition program for 5 years with 100% job placement rate for first 2 years for 26 students
- Operated a clay pottery program for 15 individuals with I/DD who learn the craft of creating decorative and functional items; started a community garden and HealthMatters classes for 12 individuals
- Held 2nd Annual Wings for Autism in collaboration with The Arc's of High Point, W-S, Autism Society, Autism Unbound, Delta Airlines and PTI Airport
- Held 5th Annual NC Self Advocate Conference in collaboration with The Arc of High Point, Enrichment Center of Winston-Salem, The Arc of Davidson County & The Arc of NC.
- Provided turkey dinners for 25 families for Thanksgiving
- Provided over 285 individuals and 938 gifts to individuals with significant needs for Christmas through Operation Santa Claus
